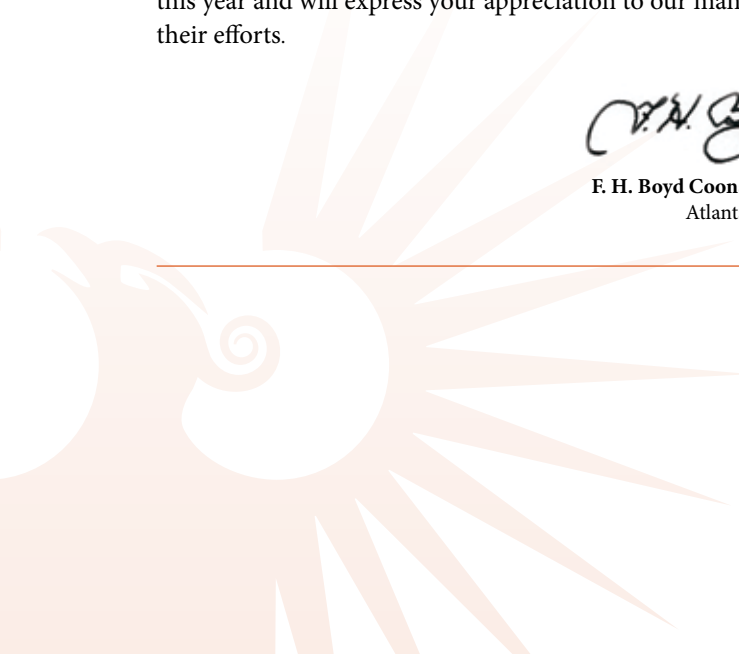

About Phoenix Flies

The Phoenix Flies: A Celebration of Atlanta's Historic Sites was created in 2003 by the Atlanta Preservation Center as a way to celebrate the 25th anniversary of the dramatic rescue of the Fox Theatre, an event that changed Atlanta's preservation outlook forever. 2018 is the 15th time that the APC has brought together organizations and individuals from the community to demonstrate the value of Atlanta's historic built environment. During its history, the celebration has presented 1,000+ events and provided 30,000+ free opportunities to experience Atlanta's rich historic fabric. The Celebration has grown from 16 Preservation Partners and 40 events to 99 Partners and 175+ events.

Atlanta's historic built environment of buildings, landscapes and neighborhoods is an integral part of the City's culture and economy. The Phoenix Flies Celebration provides an opportunity to learn about, celebrate and strengthen these assets to the benefit of all.

Atlanta was sited in 1837 to serve as a hub for railroads and because of this was assured by geography to be a place of growth and expansion. At the end of the War in 1865, over half of the City had been burned and its infrastructure destroyed. Nonetheless, in 1868, it became the State's Capital and by the end of Reconstruction in 1877 was physically much larger than its pre-War boundaries. We now have well over 100 years of buildings, neighborhoods and landscapes which are eligible for the National Register of Historic Places and worthy of preservation and celebration. Look for National Register designations in event listings.

The Phoenix Flies Celebration is an annual program of the Atlanta Preservation Center. If you know of a place that should be celebrated, please contact us so that we may consider including it in next year's program.

Priority reservations for Atlanta Preservation Center members only will begin Thursday, February 8, and continue through Thursday, February 22. Atlanta Preservation Center members also will receive priority on reservation waiting lists. Reservations for the general public will open on Friday, February 23. About the Atlanta Preservation Center

The Atlanta Preservation Center (APC) was established as the City's first private non-profit preservation organization.

Founded in 1979, the Atlanta Preservation Center has spent the last 38 years advocating for the City of Atlanta's historic resources and places through the means of education.

As an agency for coordination, knowledge, research and advocacy for preservation in the City, the APC works with government, business and community leaders and individuals to preserve endangered residential and commercial structures, neighborhoods and landscapes. These collective efforts have lent the local and national designation of Historic Districts, such as Fairlie-Poplar, Auburn Avenue, and Grant Park, and in protecting and redeveloping individual buildings and structures including, but not limited to, Ivy Hall, The Castle, the Georgian Terrace, the Biltmore, and, most recently, the Medical Arts Building on Peachtree. Through its Heritage Education programs, the Atlanta Preservation Center provides thoughtful preservation education for youth and adults of all ages. Our programs focus on a range of 11 guided walking tours throughout various Atlanta neighborhoods, and interactive classroom presentations and lectures focused on architecture, urban planning, and civics for students K-12.

The Atlanta Preservation Center has used the 1856 LP Grant Mansion as its headquarters since 2001, when we started to restore the long-neglected structure, the oldest and most historic building in Atlanta. 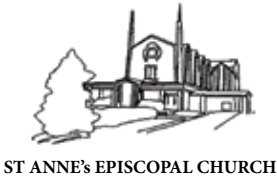

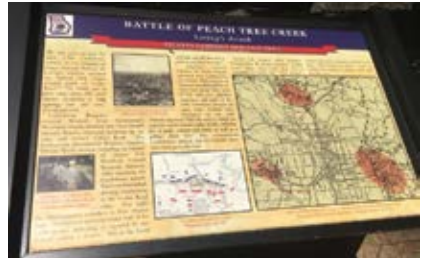
