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To Whom It May Concern,

I am writing to formally request that a cease and desist letter be reissued to Ms. Margaret Wright Boylan regarding her continued pattern of harassment toward PTSA volunteers, school administrators, and district leadership.

Over the past month, numerous individuals have received lengthy and repetitive emails from Ms. Boylan regarding the Chamblee Middle School PTSA. Multiple representatives, including members of the previous PTSA board, Council leadership, District leadership, and school administration, have consistently explained the established PTSA process to her. Despite receiving the same information from multiple sources, she continues to challenge the process through repeated emails directed at the same individuals.

At this point, this has clearly moved beyond a legitimate request for information. The repeated communications have become excessive, disruptive, and constitute a pattern of harassment. No volunteer should be expected to endure constant accusations, repeated demands, or continuous email campaigns after their questions have already been answered.

It is particularly concerning that Mr. Williams, the school's principal, as well as former PTSA board members, Council leaders, District leaders, and other school personnel continue to be subjected to these ongoing communications. These individuals volunteered to serve in leadership roles to support students, families, and schools, not to be repeatedly harassed after providing clear and consistent information.

Additionally, I respectfully request that the DeKalb County School District and Georgia PTA conduct a formal review to determine whether Ms. Margaret Wright Boylan's ongoing conduct violates applicable district policies regarding harassment, intimidation, or disruptive communications, as well as Georgia PTA's standards of conduct, ethical expectations, and volunteer responsibilities. While every individual has the right to ask questions and seek clarification, that right does not extend to repeated

and excessive communications that continue after the requested information has been consistently provided by multiple individuals. When such conduct begins to interfere with the ability of school employees and volunteer leaders to perform their responsibilities, it becomes a matter that warrants review and appropriate action.

I further request that both organizations take any steps they deem appropriate to protect school administrators, district leaders, and PTA volunteers from continued harassment. Volunteers dedicate their time to serving students, families, and schools, and they should be able to carry out those responsibilities in an environment free from intimidation, repeated personal attacks, or persistent disruptive communications.

I appreciate your prompt attention to this matter and respectfully request a response outlining the actions that will be taken to address these ongoing concerns.
